 SQ5R Method| Survey <br> Before you read, you'll already know what the chapter is about! | Read the title | $\square$ |

|  | Read the introduction and summary/conclusion | $\square$ |
|  | Read headings and subheadings | $\square$ |
| Question <br> You can use these later to study! | Turn headings and bold words into questions before you read (write these in the margins or on a separate sheet) | $\square$ |
|  | Continue to add questions as you read | $\square$ |
| Read <br> Be prepared for class! | Read one section at a time (look for answers to questions) | $\square$ |
| Recite <br> Check understanding! | Answer the questions after reading a section (write answers in the margins, write answers on a separate sheet, or highlight the answer) | $\square$ |
| Record <br> Make a note guide! | Take notes on the reading. Take your reading notes to class and make class notes on the same page. | $\square$ |
| Relate <br> Reflect! | In your notes, write down your connections (previous learning/experience) and opinions about the information | $\square$ |
| Review <br> Quiz yourself! | After you finish the entire reading, go over all questions and your notes | $\square$ |
|  | If you can't answer the questions or remember what's in your notes, go back and refresh your memory | $\square$ |
|  | Before your class, go over all questions and your notes again | $\square$ |
|  | If you can't answer the questions or remember what's in your notes, go back and refresh your memory | $\square$ |

TIPS:

- If the reading is BIG, break it up. Instead of reading 30 pages on one day, read 15 pages for two days.
- You may try different methods for different readings and classes.
- Continue to review throughout the semester to make tests easier.
