Hello and welcome to the weekly resources for REL-1310!



# Joshua & Judges

### <u>Joshua</u>

#### Characters

- **Joshua**: Became the new leader of the people of Israel after Moses had passed away.
- **Rahab**: A prostitute who housed Israelite spies in her house as they scouted out Jericho. After Jericho was taken over, she joined the Israelites as one of their own people.
- **Joshua** led the people of Israel across the Jordan River and into the Land of Canaan.
- After crossing the river, the Israelites set up a memorial made of 12 stones.

- **Joshua** sent 2 spies into Jericho to survey the city. **Rahab**, a prostitute, told them that Jericho feared their God and that the people were afraid of them. She hid them from the city's soldiers, but the Israelites realized the city was theirs to take.
- In chapter 6, **Joshua** led Israel to overtake the city of Jericho by marching around it for 6 days. Then on the 7<sup>th</sup> day, they marched around it 7 times. The priests then blew the trumpets, and the Lord caused the walls of the city to fall down. This allowed Israel to walk right in and conquer the city.
- **Joshua** divided the land of Canaan among the 12 tribes of Israel.

# <u>Judges</u>

#### <u>Characters</u>

- **Ehud**: A left-handed judge who kills the Moabite King Eglon.
- **Deborah**: Leads a general named Barak to defeat the Canaanite King Jabin.
- **Gideon**: Tests the Lord, the Lord commands him to cut down the number of soldiers in his army, and commands him to use surprise tactics to defeat the Midianites.
- **Samson**: Delivers Israel from the Philistines, but ultimately his marriage to a Philistine woman named Delilah leads to his demise.

#### <u>Judges Cycle:</u>

- 1) Israelites do evil in the sight of the Lord. (worshipping other gods, etc.)
- 2) As a consequence, they suffer oppression.
- 3) Israel cries out to the Lord.
- 4) The Lord raises a deliverer, called a **judge**. (Repeat)
