<u>Terms</u>

- **Genesis**: Greek word meaning "origin."
- **Bereshit**: Original Hebrew name of the book of Genesis (pictured above). Translated as "In the beginning," which is the first line of the book.
- **Primeval history**: The first 11 chapters of the book of Genesis. It seeks to answer questions about the beginning of the world and civilization.
- **Tohu/bohu**: Hebrew words meaning "unformed" and "unfilled." This was the state of the world before God created it.
- Adam: Hebrew word meaning "man/creature of dust"
- Adamah: Hebrew word meaning "dirt" or "dust"

"adam" from "[adam]ah" = "[dust creature]" from "dust"

Notable Characters

- God: The creator being. Called "YHWH" or "Elohim" in Hebrew.
- **Adam**: The first man God created. His name means "man," or "creature of dust." He was Eve's husband.
- **Eve**: The first woman God created. She was the wife of Adam.
- **Serpent**: The deceiving character from the Garden of Eden.
- **Cain**: Son of Adam & Eve who murdered his brother Abel.
- Abel: Son of Adam & Eve. He was killed by his brother Cain.
- Noah: Righteous man who was spared during the worldwide flood.

<u>Genesis 1</u>

- God creates the world.
- Emphasis on 7 days
- Days 1-3 form the world.
- Days 4-6 fill the world.
- Literary pattern of creation story: 1) Divine command, 2) Forming/filling of the earth, 3) summary phrase
- Large-scale, more general creation story
- God called "Elohim," translated as just "God."

<u>Garden of Eden</u>

- Genesis 2:
 - Genesis 2 creation portrays God in anthropomorphic (humanlike) terms.
 - $\circ~$ Small-scale, more intimate creation story.
 - $\circ~$ God called "YHWH," translated in this chapter as "the LORD God."
- Genesis 3:
 - The man & woman (**Adam & Eve**) are deceived by the serpent and sin.
 - This is called "the Fall."

- God curses the serpent as a result and tells the man and woman that man will endure hard work and woman will endure painful childbirth as a result of trying to live their way instead of living under God's commands.
- As man and woman are expelled from the garden, God clothes them in an act of kindness.
- Genesis 4:
 - Abel and his brother **Cain** both offer sacrifices to God.
 - **Cain** kills **Abel** because God favors **Abel's** sacrifice.
- Genesis 5: Genealogy of Adam's family

Genesis 6-9

- Humankind becomes corrupt.
- **Noah** and his family found favor in God's eyes, so God instructs them to build a boat.
- God sends a flood.
- After the flood, God makes a covenant with **Noah** to never "destroy every living creature" again (8:21).

Genesis 10

- Genealogy of **Noah's** family.
- Origin of "Table of Nations".
- Japheth's descendants: People of Asia Minor.
- Ham's descendants: Egyptians.
- Shem's descendants: Semitic peoples.

Genesis 11

- Story of the Tower of Babel.
- This story explains the presence of many languages in the Ancient Near East.
- Another example of rebellion against God (alongside eating the fruit in Eden, Cain killing Abel, and the corruption of humanity in Genesis 6).

Genesis Creation vs. Enuma

One God (Yahweh/Elohim)
One God (Yahweh/Elohim)
World created through God speaking

Peaceful story
Humans cared for by God
Humans made to be

caretakers of earth

- Multiple gods (Apsu, Tiamat, Marduk)

- World created by the goddess Tiamat's body
 - Chaotic war story
 - gods are neutral towards humans
- Humans made to be slaves of the gods
