Ezekiel



- Ezekiel initially speaks judgment on Judah, but once Judah falls, he speaks of hope.
- He believed rituals were important.
- Ezekiel received visions of the destruction of Jerusalem.
- Makes use of symbols
- The rising of the dry bones in chapter 33 represents Israel getting a new life.
